

The Murder of Ann-Marie Pomphret Case Study

THE CASE

On 2nd November 2018 at 9:47pm the husband of Ann-Marie Pomphret made an emergency call to police. Ann-Marie had been murdered in the stables near their house. What followed was an investigation which Cheshire Police described as the largest in their history to find her killer. Little did they know that the killer was in plain sight. The emergency call contained vital information which just needed the expertise to unlock the case.

CHALLENGES

In any murder investigation, police are faced with a mountain of evidence to deal with - the crime scene, collecting statements and dealing with family and friends - could they be potential suspects? Eliminating or implicating is a fine balancing act if they are related to the victim, but many investigations involve this as a core dynamic. For us as linguistic analysts, we consider the emergency call to be the very first 'interview'. We are able to discern if the caller may be the perpetrator or not - our analysis will help focus an investigation.

ANALYSIS

1 Speed - Analysis Report within a Day.

We consider an emergency call the first 'interview', and crucial to any case. Analysis of the emergency call helps eliminate or identify potential suspects. It was clear from our analysis that David Pomphret, the caller, was in fact the murderer.

2 Huge Investigative Time & Cost Savings.

David Pomphret was interviewed 15 times by police, later describing him as a 'very, very convincing liar'. Our Report identifies and clearly explains the inconsistencies in his account, and the key markers implicating him as the murderer.

3 Investigations Laser-Focused
